#### 1. Minutes and Outstanding issues from last meeting

Alex indicated that the fence is now 2m high and the gap present in the fence will be dealt with by Alex. Warwick suggests an outline plan for reducing "defensive bees"

- b. Warwick has purchased the bee-suits, Candy has labelled and listed the various sizes. The list will be laminated so it is readily at hand on Friday evenings. £132 was spent on 17 suits and a smoker. Beginners will be encouraged to buy their own suits. Patrick will unlock all the lockers for the season start.
- c. Nosema clinic for testing of apiary bees is booked for 22nd April.
- d. The BBKA membership system will be compliant with the revised data protection act. Ray is to get more details at the Spring convention.
- e. Jenny is putting together a list of speakers eg BDI research/Ray . The schedule is to be put on the website.
- f. Diane and Mick have volunteered to help with the gardening at Mole Apiary. More volunteers will be needed. This will be broached at the Mole Apiary meeting.
- g. Ray suggests setting up an area in Mole apiary for people interested in taking the general husbandry examination. He suggested changing the rules so members can have 6 colonies for a two year term.
- h. Alex has requested polish for the brass plaque. Cleaning of the floor in Millar Hall was discussed, because of the nature of the non-slip covering, buffer pads cannot be used.
