- -Hot and cold water now fully functioning at Mole. Slab and base to be completed for the new shed for shed to be ordered hopefully by October.

b. Twickenham Apiary

- -Quote for gazebo has now increased by £150, for extra £50 includes 2 man delivery and unload. Nicobuild due to do works in July and gazebo booked for end of July. £2600 for gazebo.
- -Wall Works to start third week in May re the brick wall. They do not require access to the apiary.
- -Grass mowing/strimming. Ray mentioned it hadn't been done recently.

- c. Two banners purchased for the Molesey and Ham fairs.
- d. Centenary expenses include books for mschools and first payment for film works (inc VAT)
- e. BDI and capitation have been paid
- f. Winter course payment has increased again this year. There has also been a donation of £1000 for Mole
 - £11000 income this year, £15000 spent.
 - £50000 to be directed to the deposit account (notice account) already agreed
