1. Minutes and Matters Arising

2. Apiary and Mole Works

a. Mole

- A brief summary was given by Jane S. the meeting on the previous Sunday went well. The honey sales also went well.
- Tree work: Clive is to meet with the tree surgeon (Ed Davis ??) and have the tree work done before 16th November, which is scheduled to be the working party day.
- Pear tree is to be kept but cut back to remove the dead and dying wood. Tomas Stehlik(?) has suggested that we fork the surrounding earth and mulch around the tree to prolong its health.
- Jen is to donate sapling(s) to Mole. We will wait to see after the trees are felled to see if we need new trees.
- We are to ask Tomas Stehlik. for advice re the trees.
- Action: CH
- It was suggested that we buy a poly nuc for Mole communal use primarily for collecting swarms that are issued within Mole apiary. Warwick to buy.
- Signage: Ray N or Patrick B to pick up sign when available. Cost is £130. The sign is to be attached to the gate.

Proposed: Jane S. Seconded: Ray N.

Accepted:unanimously

- Working party: is to take place at Mole on Saturday 16th November 10am onwards. This is to:
 - Replace fence panels to the right of the entrance
 - Lay flagstones for the base of the new shed

The panels should be of featherboard as they are more robust.

Alex L to get quotes for both the featherboard and the flagstones. Action:A

- Mission objective: lack of progress at Mole has long been put down to lack of direction. We now have a mission objective ie. over the course of 5 years to use Mole to educate the public in bees and beekeeping. This will bring Mole into line with Twickenham regarding the aims of the our charitable status and will help justify spending money on the development of Mole as an apiary.
- Offer by developers: Ray was approached by a developer at Mole saying his company would like to buy the Mole site. In exchange they would help find us a new site and build us a new clubhouse. Offers by developers are frequently received by members of T&TVBKA but usually rejected out of hand as being against the ethos of the association. However, it has been suggested that future offers should be made visible to the committee and given due consideration before we reject them.

 'Magical Molesey' is an event held in Molesey to promote Molesey. Jane S. has suggested that we take a stall there to promote bees and beekeeping. This is to take place in November.

- Addition to Mole rules: Wherever possible, when members of the public are visiting Mole apiary, hives shouldn't be opened for inspection. We don't want to risk members of the public being stung unnecessarily. This is the same rule that is in force at Twickenham. In fact, the Twickenham rule is more stringent in that we don't open hives the night before members of the public are due to visit.

b. Twickenham Apiary

- The new hide requires additional 30 metres of 'rip-stop' fabric. It is envisaged that the hide will need three sides to be covered. Including fittings this will need a budget of £500.

- A school would like us to man a stall at their school event. This was declined in that we don't have the volunteers.
- A charity for vulnerable people has asked us if we would maintain their hives for them. The request was to be put to the membership to see if anyone wanted to do it. **Action:WF**.
- Katie from Waldegrave school was looking to work alongside a beekeeper for work experience but we are not set up for this.
- BeeCraft magazine is looking for a suitable photograph to publish to commemorate our centenary. It was thought that Alice Cooper (centenary film producer) would be the most appropriate person to deal with this.

5. Treasurer's Update (Warwick)
