4. Treasurer's update (NH)

5. Visit to Newbury BKA

6. Open Day 2nd June

Plans are well underway. Signs and publicity have been done. Publicity has been included on other relevant websites.

Patrick has kindly taken on the money aspect of the plant stall. When Malcolm and Julia organised the plant stall there was approximately £230 profit. It is though that this is a small amount for the work involved and there is a risk of over purchasing. Viability for next year will be discussed after the Open day. Dunkirk nurseries in Egham will be used again, aprox £500 to be spent on plants. Some members (Graham et al) have kindly donated plants from their allotments to sell at no cost.

7. AOB

- a. A prototype for the sign for the outside of the Apiary has been produced. The cost is £744 to supply and fit (reduced by £155 without fit). The motion is passed, the committee is happy to proceed with supply and fit. Some alterations required: founded 1919 rather than since 1919. Open sans font.
- b. Library: A stock take has been completed for all the main cupboards. A large stack of leaflets and the reserve collection also has to be audited. A list of new books for people taking modules has been made. £1000 is total spend for these new books. Kim will cross check what we have got in stock and what we need before putting this to the committee. The valuation of the old stock has not been done recently. Some books are out of print / old editions. To contact Mike Scotton /Chris Deaves to find out when this was last done. Kim would like to thank all the volunteers who have helped with the stock take.
