BBKA Asian hornet day, Ray attended, recorded sessions available, link to be sent by Ray Alistair Christie from Jersey included in the list of speakers.

Of interest to everyone, there are 4 phases from prevention phase (1) to give up (4). Jersey is in phase 3 (manage). Andrew Durham has indicated that in France and Spain the government has given up. Defences are now front of hive, mesh deters AH and bees can get in and out. Electric harp used, which deters AH lets bees through, although can shock the beekeeper! Every hornet trapped and genome checked for provenance, they are trapped with a simple dish with paper towel dipped in trappit or pressed apple juice.

Hornets close to nest are aggressive, a special beesuit has been developed by BB wear. Away from their nests they are no more aggressive than European hornets.

Some French beekeepers are covering trapped queens with pesticide. Ray to email the link
