GE to contact BBKA to ask their official line about honey bees and lack of forage **ACTION: GE**


SHOP – Harvey Kirk

Harvey is away so nothing to report.


MARKETING COMMUNICATIONS AND SOCIAL MEDIA - Mandy Moss

- Attempting to apply for free Adobe Express Pro via Techsoup



















CIO UPDATE

HONEY PREP ROOM – Patrick Brennan

This Year had seen 43 bookings by Members and 4 by Association members. Although Friday evenings were reserved for training.

Alex has fixed the motor on the small (9 frame) extractor and it is working well.

The large (12 frame) extractor is still out of action, and we are looking at obtaining a new motor.

I plan on doing a clean of the room for end of season in October.

Until the updated booking software is ordered I cannot set up new booking process for half days.

The financial management of the HPR will move to the Shop's sum up so I can confirm who has paid, along with settling tank & extractor hire.

LIBRARY - Patrick Brennan

I would like to thank Mandy for branding, reviewing and in most cases rewriting instructions on how to apply for access and user instructions.

In 2026 I would like to hold a talk on library use, review library contents to decide what books and surplus to requirement. And hopefully buy some books that will help with module revision.

TALKS – Patrick Brennan

Been a bad year people who we tried to book did not return calls. I have called a sub-committee meeting to discuss approach for next year.

APIARY MANAGEMENT – Ray Nicol

Varroa treatments will need to come off soon. The treatments mustn't be left on over Winter. This can be done in October. Either Ray will do it or can press gang others to help.

Now the cooler weather has arrived, we can start wax rendering.

Ray needs to get Burco boiler fixed before it can be safely used for frame cleaning.

IT INFRASTRUCTURE – Ray Nicol

Ray to progress getting website renamed to www. Twickenham-bees.org.uk and getting SSL/TLS certificate added so it becomes a https site.

Purchase and add HPR enhanced booking software.

Investigate search engine optimisation re topics such finding suppliers of local honey.

ADULT EDUCATION – Ray Nicol

Module study group started for module 2. Two takers so far.

Still putting together the year 2 course. Will be looking for contributions and criticism shortly.

The year 2 course will fit in with the production hives.

Looking to create a path for those who may be interested in teaching eg anyone who has done the Basic who might be interested in helping a teacher and progressing from there?

Looking at ways to give more support for those doing GH26. Maybe teach/ help teach Honey Bee Health?

ASIAN HORNET – Ray Nicol

129 nests found so far this year.

Soon need to make plans about mobilising the association members for Spring trapping.

GARDENING – Christine Betley

Spring bulbs (Aliums, crocus, muscari etc.) have been ordered and invoice given Warwick. Hope to plant in the next couple of weeks.

2. MEMBERSHIP AND FINANCE REPORT (WF) - ANY ISSUES

The Finance Report was circulated prior to the Meeting. No change in Membership. Capilisation paid up. £538 still cannot be accounted for in 2024 Accounts. It was thought that it could have been donations for the Winter Course taken on Sum Up.

Gift Aid of around £1000 still to come in.

HONEY SHOW UPDATE

WF has ordered a set of printer toners in case they are needed prior to the honey show.

GE has bought a camera to put in front of a beehive which could be played though a TV at the honey show.

A speaker is still needed. MM to contact the 'wasp lady' regarding the possibility of her giving a talk at the Presidents' Evening.

PB proposed that they are provisionally approved pending some corrections as discussed. Seconded by MM. All in favour.

HONEY PREP ROOM

Issues to resolve – winterisation (install heater etc), payment feedback loop, software upgrade? costs summary, current extractor issues and are they fixed/manageable- new extractor purchase?

PW gave an update on a proposed system to keep the HPR slightly heated. It was agreed to go ahead.

5. ANY OTHER BUSINESS

SE raised the matter of GE emailing her directly about the Petersham Nursery extraction. She was not happy about being singled out and thought for clarity, there should be a Policy regarding use of the HPR

GE apologised and had hoped it did not need to be a Committee decision, asking what the Policy was if a Member is extracting honey for a commercial outlet.

WF advised the current Policy stated the HPR could only be used by full members.

It was agreed that further consideration should be given to this matter. Next year use of the HPR will be charged in four hourly units and the charges will be in four hourly units to make it fairer for those only extracting a few frames. The Unit cost also needed to be calculated. To be added to the Agenda for the next meeting.
